Speakers

David A. Felton, D.D.S., M.S., F.A.C.P., served as director of Graduate Prosthodontics from the University of North Carolina School of Dentistry at Chapel Hill from 1989-1992 and chair of Prosthodontics from 1992-2002. He is a past president of the American College of Prosthodontists and serves as editor-in-chief of the *Journal of Prosthodontics*. His research interests include dental implants, all ceramic crowns, fixed partial dentures, and biological responses to restorative dental procedures. The author of more than 40 journal articles and 120 abstracts, Dr. Felton has presented on the national and international levels.

Robert Kreyer, CDT, owner of Kreyer Dental Prosthetics in Larkspur, California. Mr. Kreyer is a graduate of the U.S. Army Medical Field Service School Dental Technology program. He is a published author of numerous articles on complete denture prosthetics and has lectured extensively throughout the U.S. Mr. Kreyer is a member of several dental organizations, including the California Dental Laboratory Association, The American Prosthodontic Society, The L.D. Pankey Alumni Association, and The American College of Prosthodontists Dental Technician Alliance.

Frank R. Lauciello, D.D.S., Director of Removable Prosthodontics, Ivoclar Vivadent. Dr. Lauciello graduated from the State University of New York at Buffalo (SUNY), School of Dental Medicine in 1969 and completed his Prosthodontic training at the Buffalo VA Medical Center. He is an Associate Professor in the Restorative Department at SUNY at Buffalo and was director of the Veterans Administration Advanced Prosthodontic Program from 1973-1998. Dr. Lauciello has authored 25+ articles including several chapters of textbooks. He is actively involved in dental research and has served as Co-Chair of the Dental Implant Clinical Research Group (DICRG). Dr. Lauciello is a Diplomate of the American Board of Prosthodontics.

Patrick M. Lloyd, D.D.S., M.S., Professor, Division of Prosthodontics, Department of Restorative Sciences and Dean, University of Minnesota School of Dentistry. Dr. Lloyd is a Diplomate of The American Board of Prosthodontics and past president of the American College of Prosthodontists.

Thomas D. Taylor, D.D.S., M.S.D., Professor and Chairman, Department of Prosthodontics and Operative Dentistry at the University of Connecticut. Dr. Taylor is involved in both clinical and laboratory research and has published extensively in the prosthodontic literature. He is prosthodontic editor and abstract editor for the *International Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Implants*. He is a Diplomate and past president of the American Board of Prosthodontics and currently serves as the Board's executive director.
