Guest Speaker

Stanley F. Malamed, D.D.S., Professor of Anesthesia and Medicine, University of Southern California School of Dentistry at Los Angeles; Diplomate, American Dental Board of Anesthesiology. Dr. Malamed is a recipient of the Heidebrink Award (1996) from the American Dental Society of Anesthesiology and the Horace Wells Award (1997) from the International Federation of Dental Anesthesia Societies. He has authored more than 120 scientific papers and 16 chapters in various medical and dental journals and textbooks in the areas of physical evaluation, emergency medicine, local anesthesia, sedation and general anesthesia. In addition, Dr. Malamed is the author of three widely used textbooks published by CV Mosby: Handbook of Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office (5th edition 2000); Handbook of Local Anesthesia (5th edition 2004); and Sedation —a guide to patient management (4th edition 2003).
