Postgraduate Program in Contemporary Esthetic Dentistry: Level I

Goal: to provide a University—based postgraduate program in contemporary esthetic dentistry which will prepare practicing dentists to select and use contemporary materials and techniques based on scientific evidence. Dentists will be exposed to a diversity of philosophies, materials and laboratory experiences that will give them the knowledge and skills to incorporate the latest materials and techniques into practice.

Credits: 100 hours of continuing education credit
25 hours/per Weekend

Award: You will receive a certificate of completion from the University of Minnesota after successful completion of the Level I program and the written examination. Completion of Level I is a prerequisite for the Level II and III programs.

WEEKEND ONE: Foundations of Esthetic Dentistry

Objectives: The graduate will be able to:

1. determine which bonding agents and procedures are clinically most effective.
2. evaluate the comparative strengths and weaknesses of composite, cement, bleaching and other esthetic materials.
3. select, manipulate, and place direct esthetic restorative materials.
4. prepare invisible anterior veneers using microfills, hybrids, tints and opaques.
5. correct color and contour problems using composite materials.
6. improve esthetic results through a sequence of contouring, characterizing, finishing and polishing.
7. understand and utilize the AACD accreditation standards during clinical photography.
8. select appropriate camera systems and films for documenting clinical cases.
9. integrate occlusion and function with esthetic dentistry.
10. record bite registration and determine centric relation.

K. William Mopper, D.D.S., M.S. is a leading expert on cosmetic bonding. He is a frequent speaker for several prestigious national meetings, including the Greater New York Dental Meeting, the Chicago Midwinter Meeting, the California Dental Society Meeting and the Hinman Dental Meeting. In addition, he is a continuing education faculty member for the Postgraduate Program in Esthetic Dentistry at SUNY Buffalo as well as at other dental schools. Dr. Mopper is co—author of “A Complete Guide to Dental Bonding” and co—author of a chapter “Coloring with Resins,” in *Esthetic Composite Bonding*, a text by Ronald E. Jordan. He has written articles for many professional publications, has been a consultant to major facets of the dental industry and is the Co—Founder and Chairman of Cosmedent, Inc.

Paul Olin, D.D.S., M.S., Associate Dean, Clinical Systems; Director, Dental Implant Program; Associate Professor, Division of Prosthodontics, Department of Restorative Sciences, University of Minnesota, School of Dentistry. In addition to his administrative and teaching responsibilities, Dr. Olin practices part—time in the faculty practice at the School of Dentistry. He has extensive clinical and teaching experience with porcelain veneers and with other areas of esthetic dentistry. *Dr. Olin is the Director of the Postgraduate Programs in Esthetic Dentistry: Levels –III at the University of Minnesota School of Dentistry.*

Edward J. Swift, Jr., D.M.D., M.S, Professor and Chair, Department of Operative Dentistry, University of North Carolina, School of Dentistry at Chapel Hill. Dr. Swift is actively involved in dental materials research, particularly in the areas of dentin bonding and other aspects of adhesive and esthetic dentistry. He has published over 170 journal articles and has written eight textbook chapters. Dr. Swift is a member of the editorial boards of *Practical Periodontics and Aesthetic Dentistry*, *Operative Dentistry*, *Journal of Dentistry*, and *American Journal of Dentistry* and is the Associate Editor for the *Journal of Esthetic Dentistry*. He maintains a part—time intramural practice devoted to restorative and esthetic dentistry.

Daniel H. Ward, D.D.S., Assistant Clinical Professor, The Ohio State University, and private practitioner, Columbus, Ohio. Dr. Ward lectures for the Postgraduate Programs in Esthetic Dentistry at SUNY Buffalo and at the University of Minnesota. He is the Examiner for all of the PGED programs. He is a member of the American Society for Dental Aesthetics and serves as editor of the *ASDA Journal*. He has published numerous articles and lectured worldwide.
