Speakers

Michael D. Rohrer, D.D.S., M.S., Professor and Director, Division of Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology, Department of Diagnostic and Biological Sciences, University of Minnesota School of Dentistry. Dr. Rohrer spent 22 years on the faculty of the University of Oklahoma, where he was a Presidential Professor, prior to joining the University of Minnesota faculty in May 2000. He is the Director of the Hard Tissue Research Laboratory through which he collaborates with many researchers throughout the U.S. and abroad in the areas of dental implants and bone augmentation strategies. In addition to his teaching and research responsibilities, Dr. Rohrer maintains an active practice of surgical and clinical oral and maxillofacial pathology. He has been named outstanding instructor by four graduating classes at Oklahoma and three classes at Minnesota. Dr. Rohrer is a Fellow of the American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology, a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, and a Diplomate and Immediate Past President of the American Board of Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology. Currently, he is serving as president-elect of the American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology.

Lewis Roy Eversole, D.D.S., M.S.D., M.A., part-time Professor of Pathology and Medicine, University of the Pacific School of Dentistry and lecturer in pathology, Arizona School of Dentistry and Oral Health. Dr. Eversole is in private practice at Pacific Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology and at Oral Pathology Diagnostic Services in San Diego. He also conducts a clinical consultation practice in La Jolla, California. Dr. Eversole is an author of five textbooks in oral pathology and oral medicine and has contributed chapters to twelve other books. He has authored over 200 papers in refereed journals in the fields of oral and sinonasal/head and neck pathology. Dr. Eversole has lectured throughout the world on oral pathology and oral medicine. He is a Diplomate and Past-President of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology. He is also a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral Medicine. Dr. Eversole served as President of the Experimental Pathology Group for the International Association of Dental Research; his research interests are molecular oncology of oral cancer and immunopathology of oral mucosal diseases. He is currently President of the American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology.
